Notice of Location.

Notice is hereby given, that the undersigned, having complied with the requirements of Section 2324 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, the Laws of the State of Utah, and the Local Laws, Customs and Regulations of this District, has located fifteen hundred feet in length by six hundred feet in width, on this, the Great Wonder Lode, vein or deposit, bearing Gold, Silver, Lead, Copper and other valuable metals, situated in Hot Springs Mining District, Salt Lake County, State of Utah, and claim seven hundred and fifty linear feet along the course of the vein in a northeasterly direction from this point of discovery, and seven hundred and fifty linear feet along the course of the vein in a southwesterly direction from this point of discovery, and three hundred feet in width on the southeasterly side of the center of the vein, and three hundred feet in width on the northwesterly side of the center of the vein, the general course of said vein, as nearly as can be traced, being northeasterly and southwesterly, and the location being described and marked on the ground as follows, to wit:

Commencing at this discovery and running thence 750 feet in a northeasterly direction to post No. 1. Thence in a southeasterly direction 300 feet to post No. 2. Thence in a southwesterly direction 1500 feet to post No. 3. Thence in a northwesterly direction 600 feet to post No. 4. Thence in a northeasterly direction 1500 feet to post No. 5.
